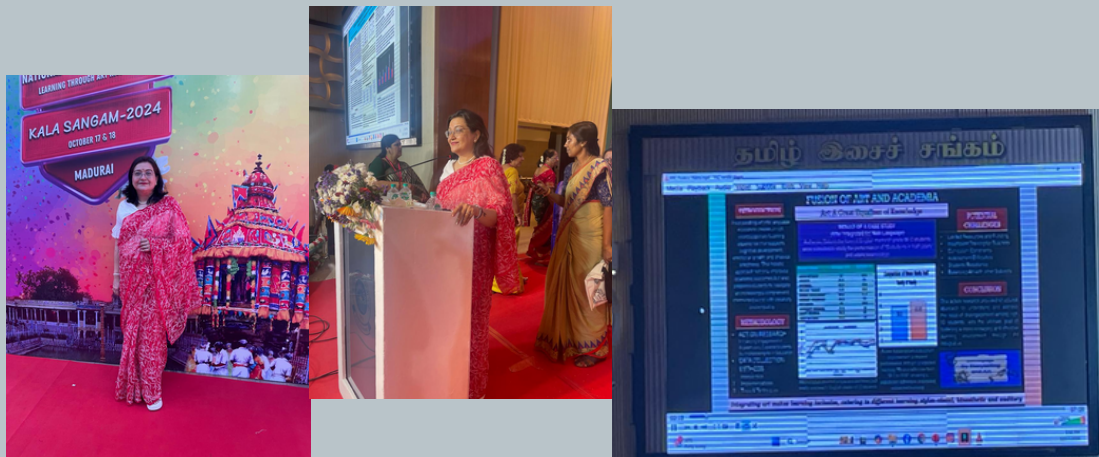
## Dear Parents and students

## SOLO SONG COMPETITION: FIRST PRIZE WINNER

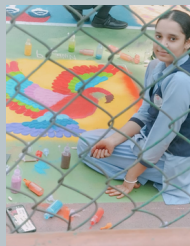

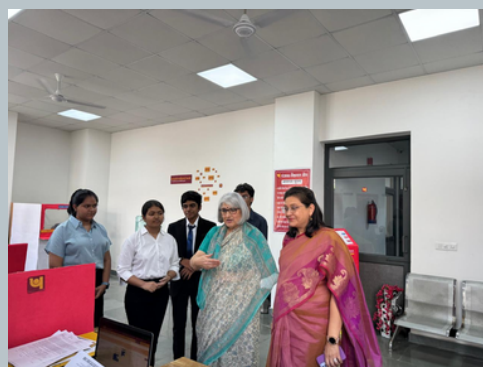


## RAILWAY STATION SCENE AWARENESS PROGRAMME TO INSTILL CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY
